Safety of Pure Hazelwood Products

Our first capsule was about the safety of hazelwood necklaces for babies and children. To continue on this subject, today's topic explains why **our necklaces are the safest on the market.**

First we need to clarify what we mean when we say necklace safety. Some parents call us to say their child has pulled on the necklace and broken it. This is absolutely normal and it is what is supposed to happen. **Beware of necklaces that don't break with tension, as they could be a choking hazard.**

That being said, if the necklace must break, **the little pieces shouldn't fall apart.** The clasps on Pure Hazelwood necklaces have been chosen to meet the highest safety standards for children's jewelry. They comply with the standards of the CPSC in North America and of the AFNOR standards in Europe.

For example, if the necklace gets jammed in a blanket stitch, or if the child pulls on it, the clasp opens and releases the wire but the beads will be held onto the wire by clamps so that the child cannot access the small pieces. **We work with accredited laboratories to ensure that Canadian, American, and European safety standards are met.**

We also work with the highest quality material. The wire is covered with nylon for its high wear resistance and for its soft finish that reduces the risks of cuts and scratches. Our jewelry is made with natural gemstones, glass or wood beads, or other beads, all of which are lead and cadmium free.
